What LectureGlyph Is

LectureGlyph helps you prepare a handwritten explanation before you teach it. Instead of drawing every line live while you talk, you write the page once, choose where the important pauses should happen, and then let the page rebuild itself one stroke at a time.

When the page pauses, you explain. You can point to the work, connect ideas, ask questions, and focus on the people in front of you. The writing still feels alive because it appears in the order it was made, but you are no longer rushing to create it while teaching.

You can also share the page, so the people you teach follow along and fill in the parts you leave for them.

This is useful for ideas that need to unfold step by step, such as equations, diagrams, graphs, processes, and examples. LectureGlyph is about showing how an idea comes together, not just the finished answer.

Quick Start

The basic workflow from notebook creation to export.

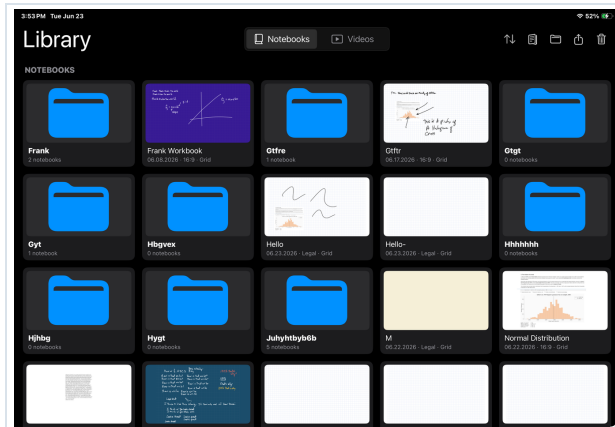
Step	Action	What to do
1	Create a notebook	Open Library, tap the new notebook button, choose name, color, paper size, orientation, and paper style.
2	Write or draw	Use the Page Floating Toolbar to select a pen, adjust size, choose colors, or erase marks.
3	Add stop points	Use stop points when one idea should finish before the next idea appears during playback.
4	Play Back	Play back your strokes
5	Record	Tap Record to capture strokes, timing, and audio.
6	Export	Use Share to export pdf, notebook, or recording.

Library

Create, find, organize, sort, share, and delete notebooks or videos.

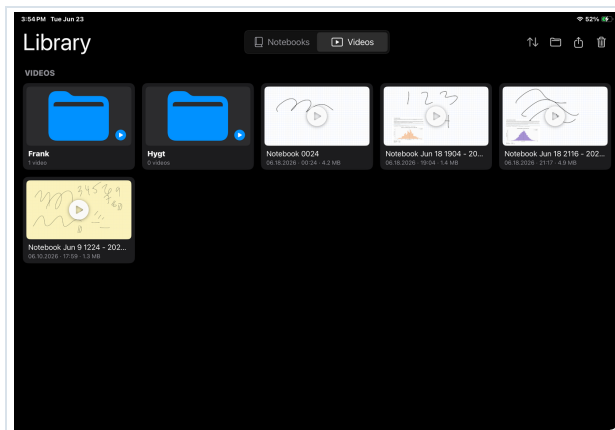
What belongs in the Library?

The Library is the starting point for notebooks, folders, video folders, and recordings. Use this section when you are not inside an open notebook page.



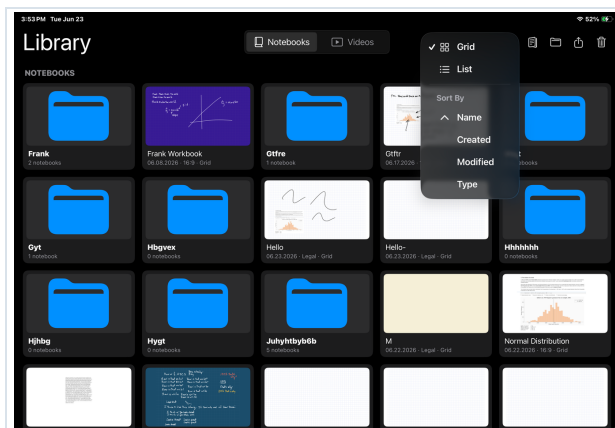
Notebooks tab – finding folders and notebook files.

- Open the Library.
- Choose Notebooks at the top.
- Tap a folder or notebook to open it.



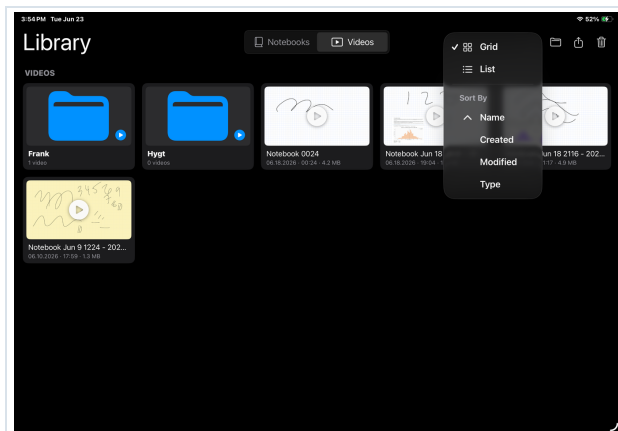
Videos tab – finding video folders and recordings.

- Open the Library.
- Choose Videos at the top.
- Tap a folder or a recording to open it.



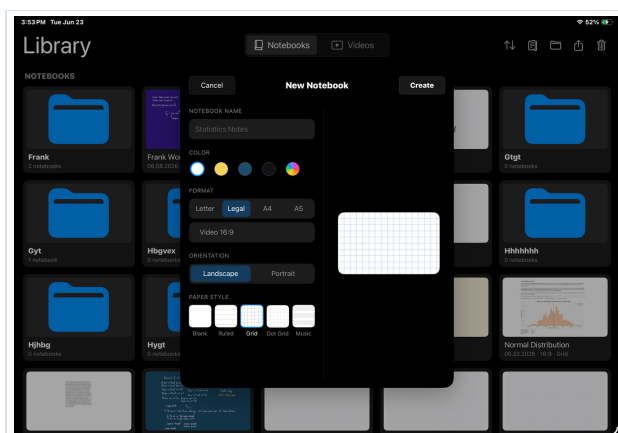
Sort & View menu, Notebooks – changing the notebook view and sort order.

- Tap the sort icon.
- Choose Grid or List.
- Sort by Name, Created, Modified, or Type.



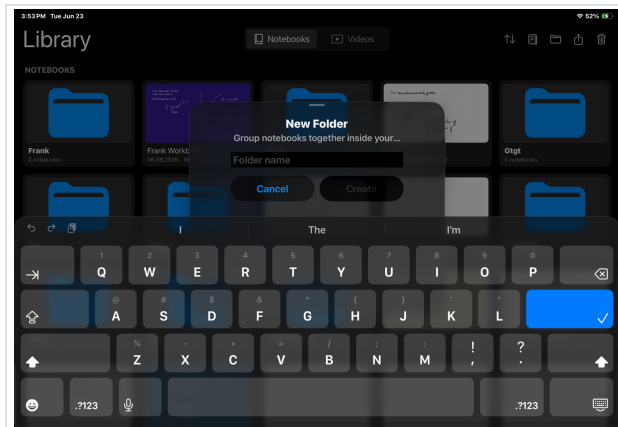
Sort & View menu, Videos – changing the video view and sort order.

- Tap the sort icon on the Videos tab.
- Choose Grid or List.
- Sort by Name, Created, Modified, or Type.



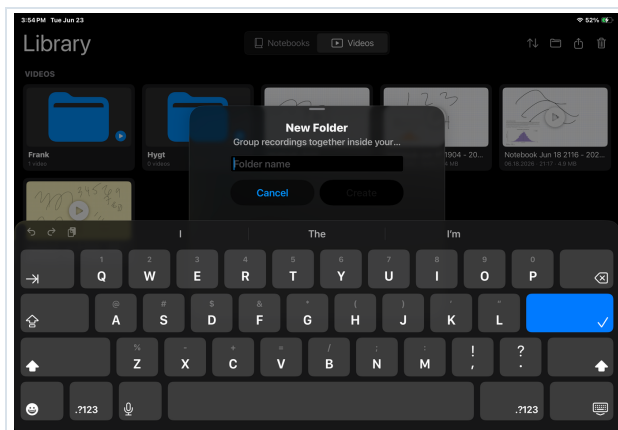
New Notebook – creating a notebook before writing.

- Tap the new notebook button.
- Enter a name.
- Choose color, paper size, orientation, and paper style.
- Tap Create.



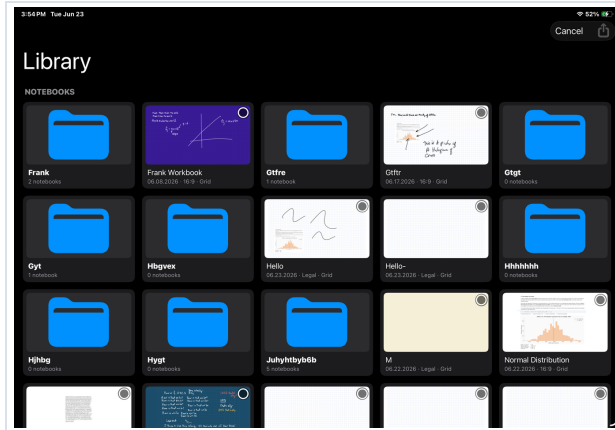
New Folder, Notebooks – grouping notebooks.

- Tap the new folder button.
- Enter a folder name.
- Tap Create.



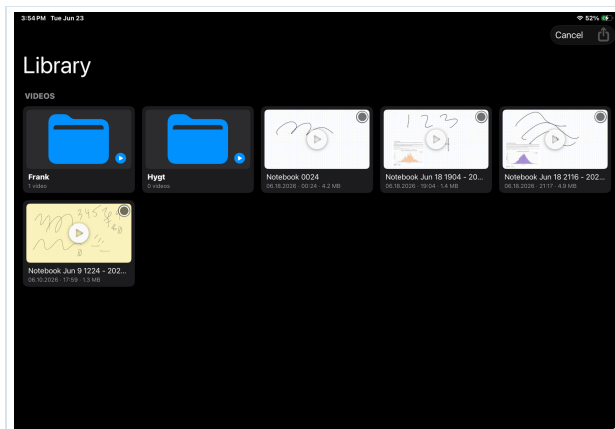
New Folder, Videos – grouping recordings.

- Open the Videos tab.
- Tap the new folder button.
- Enter a folder name.
- Tap Create.



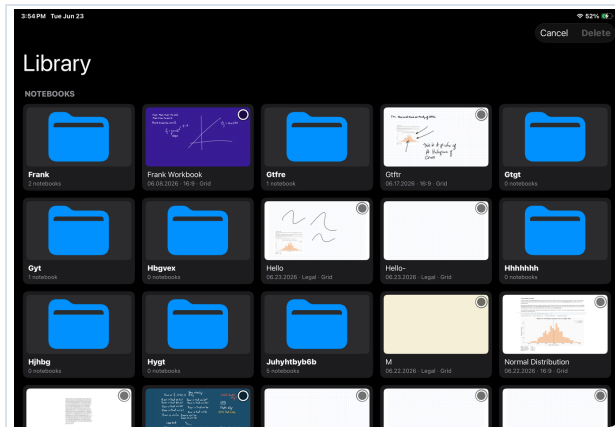
Select / Share, Notebooks – sharing one or more notebooks.

- Tap Share from the Library header.
- Select notebook cards.
- Tap Share.



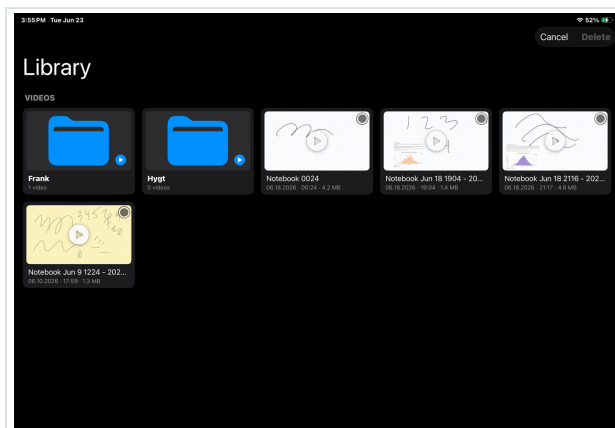
Select / Share, Videos – sharing one or more recordings.

- Open the Videos tab.
- Tap Share.
- Select recordings.
- Tap Share.



Select / Delete, Notebooks – deleting one or more notebooks.

- Tap the trash button.
- Select notebook cards.
- Tap Delete.



Select / Delete, Videos – deleting one or more recordings.

- Open the Videos tab.
- Tap the trash button.
- Select recordings.
- Tap Delete.

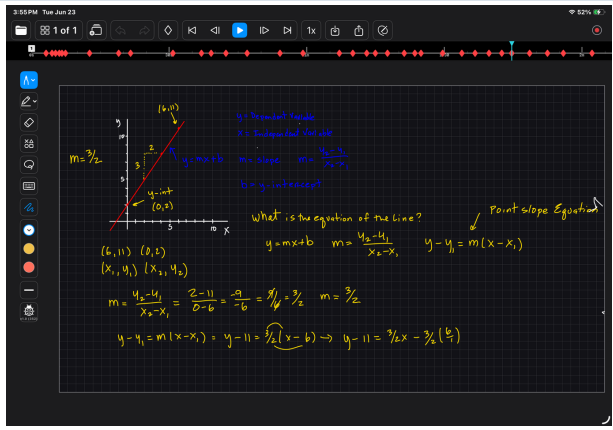
Page Top Toolbar

Controls across the top of an open notebook page.

What belongs in the Page Top Toolbar?

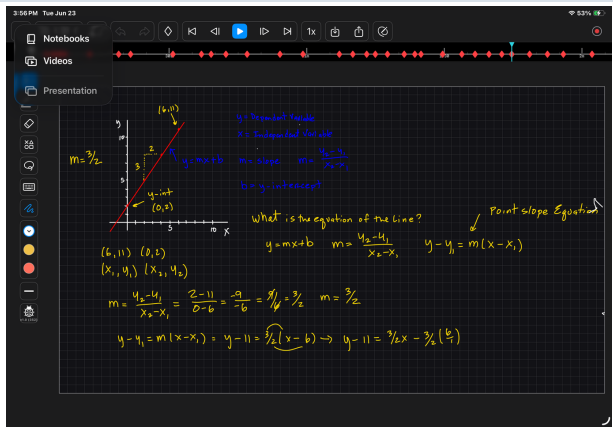
The Page Top Toolbar controls page navigation, playback, speed, importing, sharing, recording, and output. The timeline sits directly below it and shows stop points, page markers, and the playhead.

Control group	Purpose
Folder / output	Return to Notebooks or Videos, or start Presentation mode.
Page controls	Open page overview, add a page, or move through pages.
Undo / redo	Reverse or restore recent changes.
Stop point	Mark a point where the explanation should pause or advance.
Playback transport	Move backward, play, pause, or move forward.
Speed & Zoom	Change playback speed and timeline zoom.
Import / Share	Import a photo or PDF, or export the notebook.
Record	Capture strokes, timing, and audio.



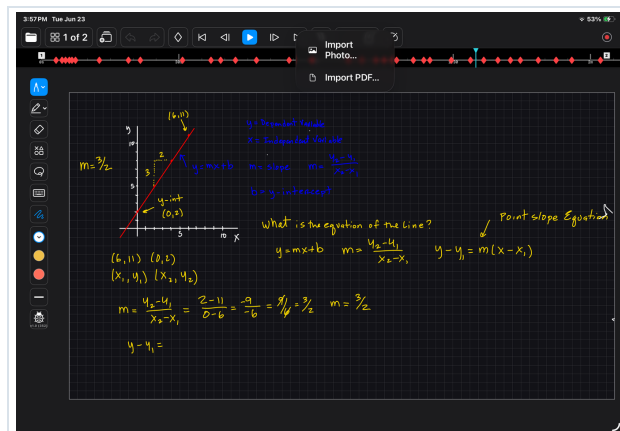
Main editor / page view – working inside an open notebook page.

- Use the top toolbar for navigation, playback, import, share, and record.
- Use the timeline strip to move through stop points and page markers.
- Use the playhead to see where you are in the recording.



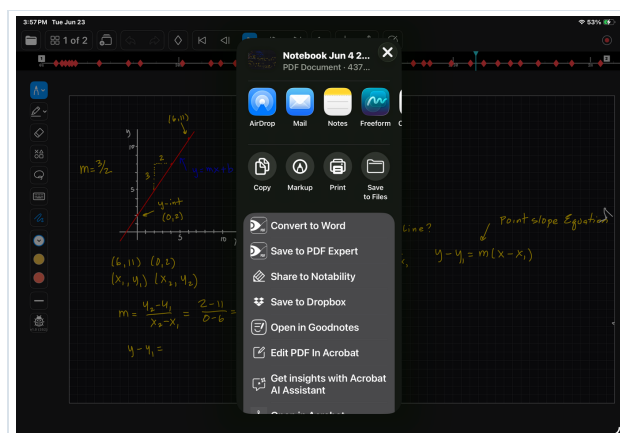
Folder / output menu – jumping to Library tabs or presentation mode.

- Tap the folder button.
- Choose Notebooks or Videos to return to the Library.
- Choose Presentation for external-display presentation mode.



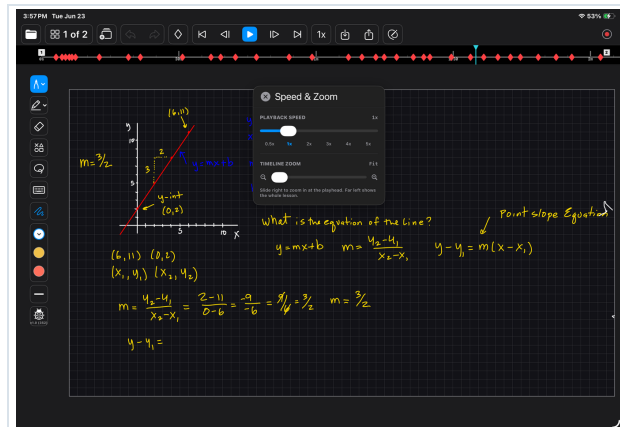
Import Photo / PDF – placing a picture or PDF on the current page.

- Tap the import button.
- Choose Import Photo or Import PDF.
- Place the item on the page.



Share / Export – exporting a notebook as a document.

- Tap the share button.
- Choose an export target, such as Mail, Files, Print, or another app.
- Send or save the exported notebook.



Speed & Zoom – changing playback speed and timeline scale.

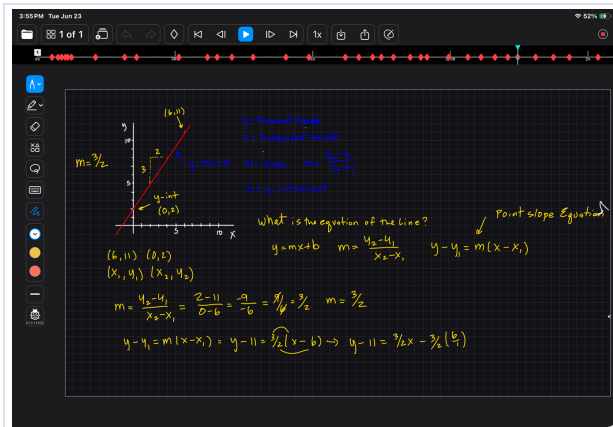
- Tap Speed & Zoom.
- Choose a playback speed from 0.5x to 5x.
- Move Timeline Zoom to fit the whole lesson or zoom in near the playhead.

Page Floating Toolbar

The left-side writing and drawing tool rail.

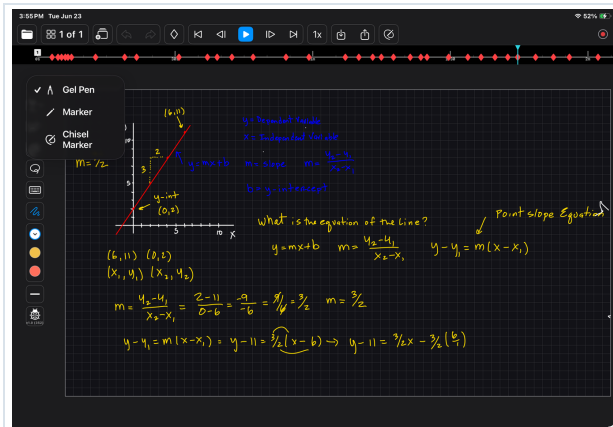
What belongs in the Page Floating Toolbar?

The Page Floating Toolbar controls what you place on the page: pen, eraser, shapes, lasso, text, scribble, colors, and stroke width. Use this section when you want to change how marks are made or edited.



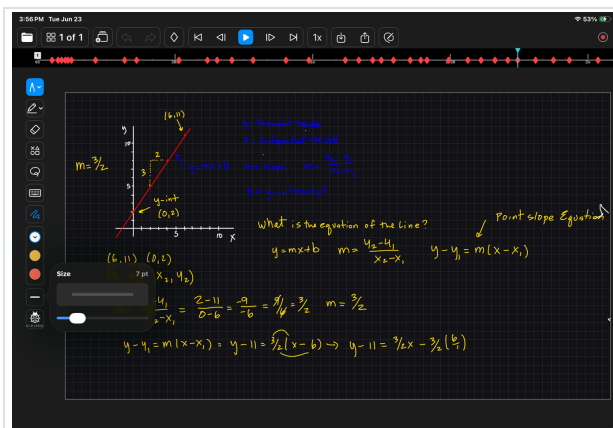
Main editor / page view – locating the Page Floating Toolbar.

- Look at the left side of the notebook page.
- Choose tools such as pen, eraser, shapes, lasso, text, scribble, colors, or width.
- Return to the top toolbar for playback, import, share, and record.



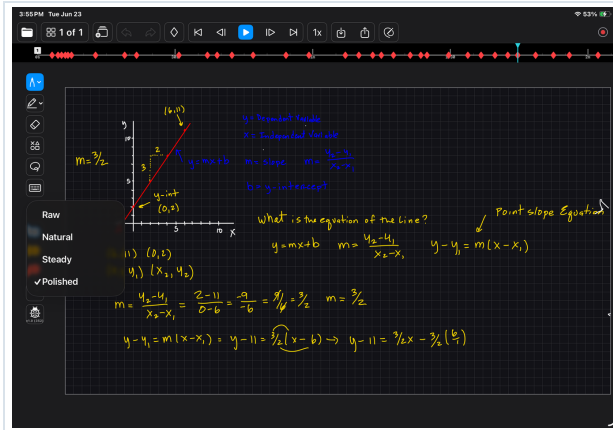
Pen-type picker – choosing the ink style.

- Open the pen tool submenu.
- Choose Gel Pen, Marker, or Chisel Marker.
- Write or draw with the selected pen type.



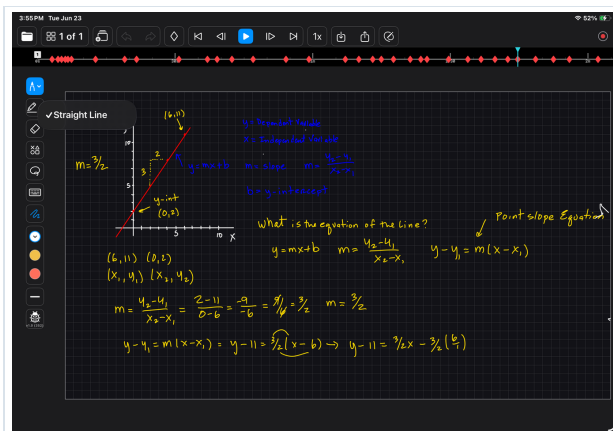
Stroke Size – changing ink thickness.

- Open the size control.
- Drag the slider left or right.
- Write with the new thickness.



Ink smoothing, Writing Style – controlling how much handwriting is cleaned up.

- Open the writing style menu.
- Choose Raw, Natural, Steady, or Polished.
- Write and compare the feel.



Straight Line – turning rough strokes into clean straight lines.

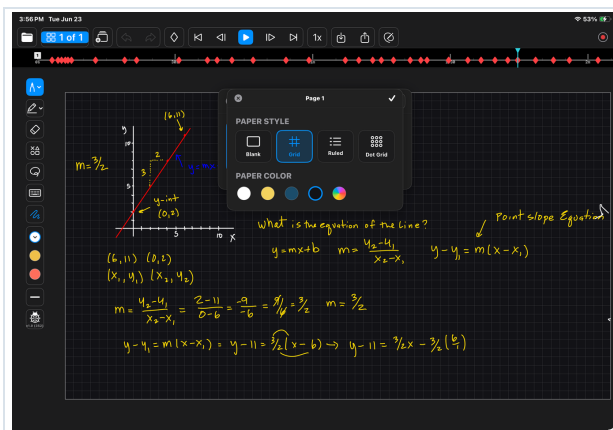
- Open the pen option.
- Turn on Straight Line.
- Draw a stroke that should become a line.

Page Settings

Controls for page appearance and page management.

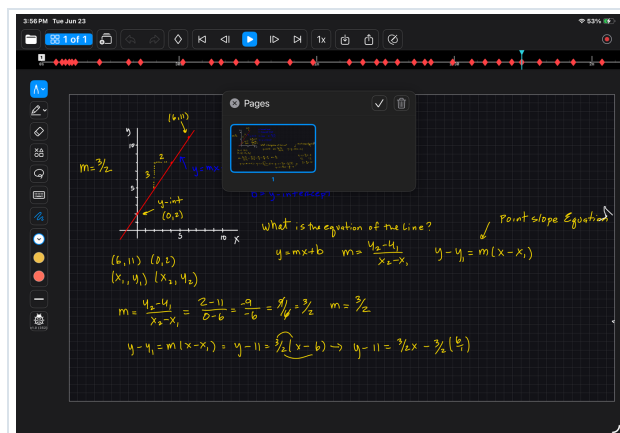
What belongs in Page Settings?

Page Settings changes the current page or helps you manage pages in the notebook. This is separate from the Page Floating Toolbar because it changes the page surface, not the ink tool.



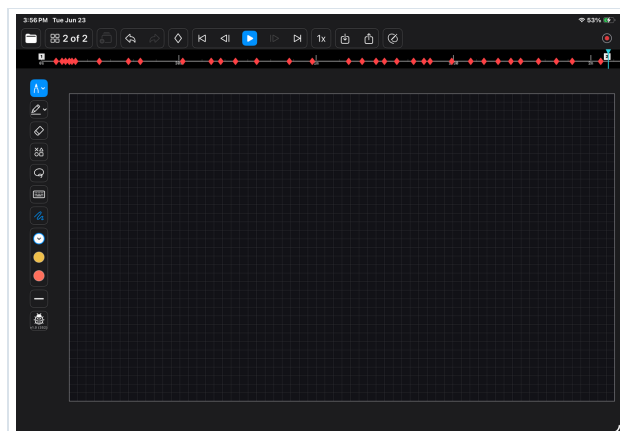
Edit Paper – changing the current page appearance.

- Open Edit Paper.
- Choose Blank, Grid, Ruled, or Dot Grid.
- Choose a paper color.
- Tap the checkmark to apply.



Pages overview – viewing, selecting, or deleting notebook pages.

- Tap the page overview button.
- Select a page thumbnail.
- Use the trash button to delete a page if needed.
- Tap the checkmark to confirm.



New / blank page – adding a new page to the notebook.

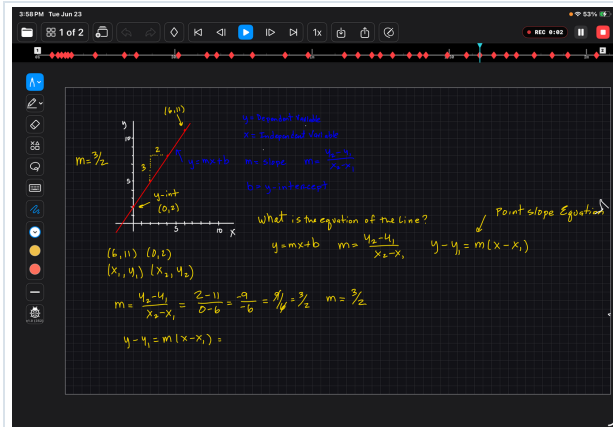
- Tap the add-page button.
- Move to the new blank page.
- Continue writing or recording.

Recording and Export

Capture an explanation and turn it into a file.

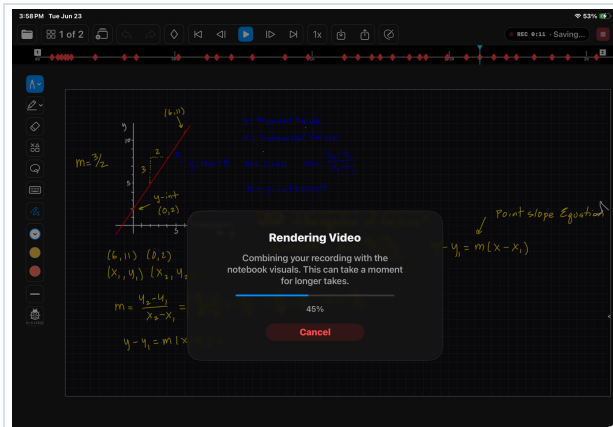
What belongs in Recording and Export?

Recording captures strokes, timing, and audio. Export sends the notebook out as a document or video, depending on the path you choose.



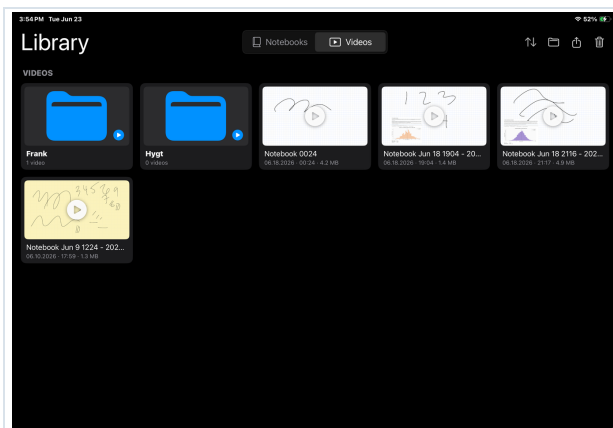
Recording – capturing strokes, timing, and audio.

- Tap Record.
- Write and speak as you work.
- Use Pause if needed.
- Tap Stop when done.



Rendering Video – turning a recording into a video file.

- Stop the recording.
- Wait while the video renders.
- Cancel only if you do not want the render to finish.



Videos library after recording – finding rendered recordings after export.

- Open the Library.
- Choose Videos.
- Open the recording or organize it into a folder.

Glossary

Terms used in this manual.

Term	Meaning
A5	A small paper size available when creating a notebook.
Content beat	A recorded moment on the timeline. In this manual, stop point is the preferred term.
Folder	A Library container used to group notebooks or videos.
Grid view	A Library view that shows notebooks or videos as cards.
Ink smoothing	A writing style setting that controls how much handwriting is cleaned up.
Library	The area where notebooks, folders, videos, sorting, sharing, and deleting are managed.
List view	A Library view that shows items in a list instead of a grid.
Notebook	A file made of pages where writing, drawing, imports, stop points, and recordings can be created.
Page	A single writing surface inside a notebook.
Page Floating Toolbar	The left-side tool rail used for writing, drawing, erasing, selecting, colors, and stroke width.
Page marker	A timeline marker that shows where a page appears in a recording.
Page overview	A floating manager that shows page thumbnails and lets you view, select, or delete pages.
Page Top Toolbar	The toolbar across the top of the notebook page. It controls navigation, playback, import, share, record, and related actions.
Paper color	The background color of the current page.
Paper style	The page pattern, such as Blank, Grid, Ruled, or Dot Grid.
Playback Speed	The speed used when replaying a recording.
Playhead	The marker that shows the current position in the timeline.
Presentation mode	An output mode used for external-display presentation.
Recording	A captured session that includes strokes, timing, and audio.
Rendering Video	Combines a recording and notebook visuals into a video file.
Share / Export	The command used to send or save a notebook outside the app.
Straight Line	A pen option that straightens a drawn stroke into a clean line.
Stroke Size	The thickness of pen or ink strokes.
Timeline	The strip across the top of the editor that shows stop points, page markers, and playhead position.
Timeline Zoom	A control that changes how much of the timeline is visible.
Video 16:9	A notebook format intended for video-shaped content.
Videos tab	The Library tab where video folders and recordings are stored.
